Part C Infant & Toddler Services

What are Part C Infant and Toddler Services?

CDC's Part C Infant and Toddler Services are primarily home-based. Services are voluntary and are provided at no out-of-pocket cost to families. Part C Infant and Toddler Services are family-focused and family driven. In collaboration with the family, a Family Support Specialist (FSS) will assist with the development and implementation of a plan to address the developmental needs of the child through visits with the family. This is accomplished by identifying child and family strengths and concerns, as well as services and supports which will be beneficial to meet those needs. A requirement of the program is that families actively participate in carrying out activities between visits. These visits can occur two to four times a month at a time and place that is convenient for the family, most often the family home.

Who is eligible for the program?

CDC's Part C Infant and Toddler Services provide support to children from birth to age three who have either a diagnosed physical or medical condition with a high probability for developmental delay, or who are experiencing delays in development in one or more areas (motor, speech, cognition, social-emotional, or adaptive).

What other services are available through CDC's Part C Infant and Toddler Services?

For families who fully participate in Part C Infant and Toddler Services, a wide variety of other possible services may be provided to meet identified needs if no other funding source is available. These include the following:

- speech therapy services
- audiology services
- occupational therapy services
- physical therapy services
- psychological services
- health services necessary to benefit from early intervention services
- nutrition services
- vision services
- assistive technology devices and services
- transportation and related costs
